Meeting Purpose	Ongoing planning for 2009 Fall Cuboree																										
Notes	<p>The Cuboree will be on October 9, 5:00 p.m. - October 11, 11:00 a.m. at Belk Scout Camp - anticipating 1,200-ish people, with the theme ROBIN HOOD.</p> <p>Last year, there were 149 Webelos; 83 Tigers; 162 Wolves; 123 Bears; 97 Siblings; 548 Adults registered for a total of 1,162 people. Teeterboard Quarterstaff - As we are now planning an Archery Demonstration as an activity either before or after lunch, we have decided not to pursue the teeterboard quarterstaff.

It was determined that the climbing wall will probably not be available, so we will open the waterfront instead for the Webelos. Any boys who were swim tested at Summer Day Camp, Webelos Resident Camp or at a valid, documentable BSA activity would be allowed to go in canoes; those who haven't could use the rowboats. New O-rings will need to be purchased for approximately \$50 to be absorbed by the Cuboree budget.

LOGISTICS: Need to ensure clear directions to Belk Scout Camp are provided. Also, put up several maps around the camp to show "You are Here" so that people can figure out where they are. John Crapster will work on finding an electronic copy of the map provided for Webelos Resident Camp.

Bathrooms - the number of portajohns required will be determined at the council level, and the costs of those will be apportioned out to the various events being held there. It was suggested that the Cuboree should bear \$350 worth of costs, and that will be included in the budget.

Lunch - it was suggested that lunch be similar to the meal provided at the Spring Cuboree (Chick-fil-a sandwiches, apples, chips, cookies and lemonade or tea). It was also suggested that lunch be available at more than one location in order to make the distribution more efficient. Christopher Kubala contacted McDonald's and received pricing of \$1 per McDouble sandwich. There was some concern noted that there is a reasonable percentage of boys and adults who can not or do not eat red meat. Additional options, including pizza and Chick-fil-a, will continue to be considered.

GIVE-AWAY: There will be two give-aways (in addition to patches) 1) A plastic cup to be distributed at check-in, and 2) sets of 3 juggling balls to be distributed at camp check-out.

VOLUNTEERS: It was suggested that a volunteer requirement be imposed similar to Day Camp - a ratio of one volunteer for every five participants was suggested.

Volunteer requirements will include: Webelos program director, Cub program director, lunch director, parking director, logistics coordination and range master. Others will be added as they are identified.
